In late summer 1992, I woke up in Plymouth, WI with a big day ahead of me. Everything was about to change. Everything that I was familiar with was coming to an end. I was leaving my beloved childhood home to go to my first day of school in a new city. This would mark my fourth school in the last four years

of my life. I had just turned 14 and I was starting 8th grade. I didn't know anyone... not one person. Time to feel awkward again, do your best not to show your emotions and hope that someone would welcome you in.

My first day of school was indeed a bit awkward, but everyone was friendly and the teachers seemed to have a good understanding of my situation and feelings. I was looking forward to the end of my first day when I heard the announcement: "Matt Moeller, please come to the office at the end of school." This was about the last thing I wanted to do but I went to the office regardless, only to hear my mom on the phone telling me that they would not be picking me up and that I was to walk home to my new house – a house I had never been in!

I often think about that story as I take the same route, from the same house, to the same school to drop my children off and pick them up. That is amazing. It is funny how you look back at life and see how God had a plan for your life every step of the way, and His plan is perfect. Perfectly planned and perfectly executed by our all knowing and ever loving Heavenly Father. It has been over 25 years since that day took place... 25 years. At the time my only thought was that I didn't want change. I wanted to just stay put, because it was what I knew. However, His thoughts are not our thoughts; neither are His ways our ways.

Over the next few weeks nervousness turned into excitement about going to the Sheboygan Christian Grade School. I felt more at home than I ever did in all my years at the public school. I found myself in an environment where I experienced Christ on a day-to-day basis: a place where I would hear and learn about life through a Biblical perspective. It became a place where my teachers quickly became Christian role models for me to follow after. My world exploded with new Christian friends and families. Mr. V. introduced me to sports! He said come play soccer and stand in front of that net. For the next nine years, I would find myself standing in front of a net playing soccer at a Christian grade school, high school and University.

SCHOLARSHIP -**SCIENCE CURRICULUM**

For the last two years, the Science Curriculum Team has been meeting to establish standards that will be used to redesign the SCS K-12 science curriculum and encourage

more inquiry based learning. Composed of Kindergarten, 4th grade, Middle school and High school teachers, the team is also working through how best to integrate a distinctive Christian worldview into the teaching of life science, physical science, earth/space science, and engineering. In addition, the staff has been studying how to integrate modern science practices into their instruction and assessments.

As scientists, the 4th grade students were asked to design their own experiments to try to relate the speed of an object to the energy of an object through collisions. They gathered data to try to support their claims.

The work has already resulted in significant changes to the SCS science curriculum and instruction. High school sophomores take a required Chemistry/Physics course. Upperclassmen can now take Advanced Placement courses in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics. Eighth grade students take an Earth/Space science course that covers the High school standards in that curricular area. The K-5 classes are implementing the new physical science standards and practices this year, with the plan to add other areas in the coming years. Students at all grade levels design and run inquiries following a K-12 established lab report format.

We are excited about the work already accomplished, and are looking forward to even more changes in the near future.

CITIZENSHIP - MISSION TRIP

As some of you may know, my dad and I were asked by Michael Panther to accompany him and a team on a missions trip to Kenya. Michael created the organization **Living With Hope**. Living With Hope is a wheelchair ministry,

and it was the first trip, so Michael didn't know what to expect. My dad and I did a lot of praying and the answer was yes. Then we got busy, getting tools, packing, flight plans, raising support, and praying. On September 8, Michael and the team met at the airport. Then late at night on the 9th, we arrived at Nairobi airport, not to say that there was a direct flight. On September 11, we did our first ministry in Kijabe at the Cure Hospital. I was a mechanic. I had to put in seat belts, order cushions and adjust leg rests. That day we fitted 80 wheelchairs. Then the next day we fitted 25. Those were our two days in Kijabe. The next day we went to Kangemi, a slum. Let me define a slum. The poorest people lived there and the people in the government don't think they even exist. That first day, we fitted 46 wheelchairs. Then, over the weekend we went on a safari. Then, when we got back to Kangemi on Monday, we fitted over 70 wheelchairs. So we fitted around 200 wheelchairs, which was good because that was all we had brought. We had a lot of fun on this trip. It was a great first time experience. It was so amazing watching lives being transformed and people getting wheelchairs. It was as if they were getting brought back to life, and I got to be a part of that. You need to go on a missions trip. It is amazing when you get to serve the people and make new friends. It was the trip of a lifetime.









A total of 200 wheelchairs were fitted during the **Living With Hope** team's time in Kenya. It was truly an amazing experience and lives were changed – both those who served on the mission trip and those in Kenya who received wheelchairs.
