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#### **SCHOOL** BOARD UPDATE

My journey at SCS began as a **Kindergartener way** back in August of 1980, nearly 40 years ago.

l attended Shebovgan

Christian Grade School all the way through the 8th grade and then moved on to Sheboygan County Christian High School where I met my wife Laura (Meeusen). To say that Sheboygan Christian School holds a special place in my heart would be an understatement.

Many things have changed in my life and in the life of the school since I graduated more than 27 years ago. Laura and I have 4 children: Zach (20), Tanner (19), Justin (16) and Maddie (12). Zach and Tanner have both graduated from SCS, Justin is a Sophomore and Maddie is in the 7th grade. Laura and I have also had the opportunity to be foster parents of two amazing kids that also attend SCS.

After Laura and I had kids, it really was not even a question of where we were going to send our children to school; SCS was the only option. Not only because we both attended SCS, but even more important, we wanted to make sure our children receive a quality Christian education. The mission statement of SCS reads: "In partnership with the Christian community, Sheboygan Christian School uses a biblical perspective to integrate academic excellence with Christ-centered learning, preparing students' hearts and minds for service in God's world." On average, our children spend about 35 hours per week in the classroom. It is important that they are learning the same core values at school as at home. SCS is filled with teachers and staff that genuinely love our children and want to see them use the gifts God has given them to their fullest. As a parent, I want to make sure I do everything I can to equip my children for life in a world where their faith will be challenged on a daily basis.

One of the things I love most about SCS (aside from the quality Christian education) is the community. Over the past several years, I have had the opportunity to be a part of the Apple Pie committee. While there is a lot of work going on during this event, every once in a while I just stand back and look out over all of the people, young and old, that come out to support SCS. As a community, we are very blessed to have multi-generational support for the school. I have had the opportunity to talk to many of the faithful

grandparents and friends of SCS and have asked them why they continue to do this year after year. Their responses are very much the same. They love being a part of the community, but even more, they value Christian education and want to do everything they can to see that it will be around for many more generations. Apple Pies is just one example of this. You will also see many of them working and supporting other fundraisers, and you may even see them at the schools cutting grass, changing light bulbs, general maintenance and many other things. Many of our supporters no longer have kids or grandkids at the school, but they see the value of SCS and want to be a part of it.

Many changes have taken place at SCS over the past few years and many more changes are coming as we work toward a K – 12 campus. God has greatly blessed SCS over the past 121 years and He will continue to bless the school as long as we put Him at the center and continue to seek His will.

### **CAPITAL CAMPAIGN & STEERING** COMMITTEE UPDATE

#### **DEAR SCS FAMILIES AND** COMMUNITY,

This letter is written at an exciting time in Sheboygan Christian School's history as we launch the public phase of our Capital Campaign – a time amidst change and challenge, optimism and the unknown, great opportunity and measurable risk. It is difficult to comprehend how far we have come and how much this school has accomplished within its 121-year history. When we review the last three years alone, we can celebrate the following milestones:

#### THIRTY-SIX MONTHS AGO, we were

at the lowest enrollment number in our school history and were carrying over \$650,000 in bank debt.

#### TWENTY-FOUR MONTHS AGO, we

saw 2% growth in enrollment, which put a stop to eight years of continual decline in students. Plans to raise funds and pay off debt were put into place.

#### FOURTEEN MONTHS AGO. a

"Marketing and Enrollment Coordinator" position was created and filled.

**TWELVE MONTHS AGO**, enrollment growth hit 4%, which included a record

SIX MONTHS AGO, SCS hired a full-time teacher to lead the Pre-K Program and focus on broadening our school's Special Needs Program.

THREE MONTHS AGO. SCS created and filled a pivotal Assistant Principal position; this key addition came with a background in directing Special Needs Programs.

This time of strengthening our school body has provided answers to the challenges of our past, but as with any change of season, new and exciting challenges now present themselves. It would be easy to celebrate the milestones listed above and suggest we take a break, wait, or pause. But in my humble opinion, the last 36 months in our storied history reminds us ever so clearly that God is moving with exuberance at Sheboygan Christian School and the community of SCS is determined and cannot be deterred from our mission.



#### KINDERGARTEN COUNTRY VISITS

Do you know where the country of Djibouti is? The Kindergarteners and Third Graders do! In September, they "traveled" to the African country, and learned how the people who live there do things.

Each month, the Kindergarteners "travel" to a different country (we call them Country Visits), with a class from the Elementary/Middle School





Campus serving as their "tour guides". The student "tourists" sample food (the rule is "You have to try it, but you don't have to like it"), play a traditional game or learn a dance, and explore the culture of the country through different activities.

While the students enjoy these special "trips" (even the Middle Schoolers look forward to their turn), they are expanding their cultural horizons while learning about God (He loves variety!) and His world. They are getting to know and serve schoolmates while also learning that all around the world people are the "same same,



but different" (a phrase that originates with vendors in Thailand). And, finally, the Kindergarteners practice empathy as they spend time praying for the people in the countries we visit.

#### PHONICS

In an effort to support our youngest readers and writers, grades Kindergarten through 2nd Grade are implementing formal phonics study as part of our curriculum. Research shows that children need explicit instruction in phonics, not as a replacement for reading or writing instruction, but rather, in addition to reading and writing instruction. Each day, the kids spend about 20 minutes doing engaging activities that help them not only understand principles of phonics, but more importantly, help them transfer that knowledge to their reading and writing.

In 2nd Grade, we have studied blends, digraphs, and vowel teams. We have practiced snap words (high frequency words), worked on "trouble-maker" words, and studied r-controlled vowels. We have worked with using capital letters purposefully, paid attention to end marks in our reading and writing, and had fun with homophones (see, sea). We also welcomed a new "student" to our class, Gus the dragon, our phonics mascot. We're having fun teaching him phonics as we learn more about it ourselves. We're also working hard to transfer our new skills to our reading and writing!

#### SPORTSMANSHIP SUMMIT

On August 22, six of our high school students traveled to Cedar Grove High School to participate in the Big East Conference Sportsmanship Summit along with other high school students in our conference. SCS students had the opportunity to meet David Cooks, national speaker and author, and heard his personal story of how his faith led him through personal challenges, perseverance, and ability to achieve his dream. David challenged students to lead by their actions, not just their words. Students also met in small groups to discuss various scenarios where sportsmanship is challenged. As a result, SCS students have created a leadership team to address sportsmanship and school spirit issues in our school.



#### **P7 BIBLE CLUB**

SCS students in the high school and middle school have started P7 Bible Clubs. Each club meets weekly after school to dive into God's Word and apply it. The seven core values that represent P7 are *accountability, communication, empowerment, integrity, leadership, relationship,* and *community*. The clubs strive to instill these values into each of its members through fun, Godly lessons and activities.
