Employment Agreement	The Coordinator of Discipleship shall be employed on a twelve month basis. It is understood and agreed that the Coordinator of Discipleship shall be employed on an at-will basis.
Overall Responsibility	The Coordinator of Discipleship is a spiritual and gifted discipler who strengthens discipleship through the intentional spiritual formation of students. This coordinator will plan, coordinate and facilitate all discipleship on the SCS campus for students and staff, under the direction of the Head of School. The coordinator will oversee all opportunities that enable students and staff to grow in Christlikeness through Word, worship, and witness. Our Vision for SCS students is that they will impact the world, both near and far, for Jesus Christ. The Coordinator of Discipleship will facilitate the demonstration of this vision through the witness of our students, the spiritual walks of the graduates we produce, and the stories of alumni who are living out this vision.
Key Tasks & Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oversee the spiritual formation program, including worship, small groups, spiritual direction/counseling, curriculum, and community outreach • Coordinate all spiritual services and events, ordinary (chapels, prayer groups) and special (conferences, outside community) • Develop and oversee SCS worship, coordinating campus lead worship, and developing an official SCS worship team • Develop and promote a "culture of discipleship," inviting students into a discipling relationship, providing training opportunities for students, staff, and families. • Develop and coordinate student/staff leadership groups that correspond with elementary school, middle school, and high school • Strength and coordinate our local church partner relationships. • Plan community events related to worship and service ministries.
