Did you ever stop to think what the world would be like five, ten or fifteen years from now? Or what Sheboygan Christian School will be like then?

If you are anything like me, it's difficult to think about what tomorrow will be like, let alone several years from now. But one of the more important things we do as a Board of Trustees at SCS is to try to plan for the future, making sure our school continues to be relevant and impactful in Sheboygan County.

This past April, our Board of Trustees and our administrative team met together to do this very thing. We spent eight hours (on the first really nice Saturday of the year) talking about the future of SCS. Thankfully, we have been blessed with a talented, strategic leadership team.

Prior to the meeting, we considered twenty topics, ranging from spiritual development to facilities to athletics to staff retention and recruitment and many more topics. In preparation for our meeting we reached out to the community members to get their input. At the meeting, we prioritized the topics and split into small groups to assess strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT).

Once the SWOT was completed, we presented back to the full team and narrowed our strategic goals down to four:

SPIRITUAL FORMATION – By the 2024/2025 school year, SCS will Identify and hire a Coordinator of Discipleship to envision and drive spiritual formation efforts; Work to form strategic partnerships with the ten area churches contributing the highest percentages of SCS students and staff; Develop a plan to recruit and train staff and student leaders in a biblical, spiritual formation process that is both scalable and repeatable.

CAMPUS SAFETY – The SCS School safety task force will urgently identify and mitigate any school safety gaps, bringing us in alignment with industry best practices by fall, 2025. To do this, we will - Immediately create a Safety Task

Force at the board level to oversee safety issues and resolutions; Create a “closed door” culture during the school day; Work with local law enforcement and/or versed consultant to identify and harden likely entry points for those who intend to commit violence, consider on-site safety team, identify whether need exists, determine and implement path forward, examine, update and implement safety policies and procedures for the school, including during open-door events, identify and resolve any other potential safety issues.

STEM/ACADEMICS – Increase Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Courses and Outcomes by: Increased course opportunities which incorporate engineering and design principles – by 2028, SCS will expand STEM courses and extra-curricular opportunities by 20%; Increased math achievement – by 2026, at least half of all students will be proficient/advanced on state math assessments (Forward Test, PreACT, ACT); Increase students' post-secondary preparation – by 2028, 20% of graduates will leave SCS with credits related to a STEM field in colleges, trades, or tech schools.

SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT – By the 2025-2026 school year, SCS will: Provide staff training in the area of Social and Emotional Learning (SEL); Incorporate faith based SEL lessons into our curriculum to help students better understand their thoughts and emotions, to become more self-aware and to develop more empathy for others within the community and the world around; Increase staff in the counseling/guidance department to address the needs of students; Partner with local churches and youth pastors to better serve our students in the area of social and emotional health.

There is certainly a lot of work that needs to be done, but my dad always reminded me, before his recent passing, to lean on the Lord for strength. His favorite verses come from Ephesians 3:20-21, “Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us, to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.” God is hard at work at Sheboygan Christian School and he will continue to give us the strength and wisdom to continue to be an institution of change, changing one life at a time, for the Glory of God!

ACCREDITATION '23

As educators, learning, progress, and growth are so energizing. To see improvement in learning is motivating and encouraging. At SCS, improvement is not just for students. Our SCS team received encouragement for their work from the accreditation site team.

SCS is accredited by two agencies: Christian Schools International and Wisconsin Religious Independent School Accreditation. SCS teacher teams worked for one year compiling and documenting evidence that our school meets a variety of indicators and standards (85 to be exact!) As a result of that work, our School Improvement Team developed School Improvement goals to address areas of focus for future work. In March, a team of 12 individuals from a variety of schools across the state spent three days in our school, validating our evidence, observing, and interviewing teachers, students, and parents.

As a result of the accreditation process, SCS received the following commendations:

- 1. Sheboygan Christian School is to be commended for its dependence on God’s faithfulness, focus on mission, and legacy of generations committed to the school for almost 125 years. Through times of abundance and difficulty, the school has remained true to God’s calling to provide Christ-centered education.
- 2. The school has hired qualified administrators who not only have a heart for Christian education but are highly skilled in their positions. All stakeholders affirm a high level of trust and respect for the current head of school and her visionary leadership, deep engagement, love for Christ and how she loves students as Jesus does.
- 3. Parents and students note their appreciation for teachers and staff and how they model Jesus, live out their faith, and commitment to their calling. Teachers and staff establish a strong foundation for faith development in students, sincerely love and care for students, and support them in their learning in innovative ways and in partnership with families. Students are respected and valued. It is the desire of the staff to make individual connections with every student and support them with what they need in order to thrive in the school setting.
- 4. Schoolwide, Sheboygan Christian School engages deeply in the work of Teaching for Transformation which supports

each teacher in developing rich biblical understanding within their content areas and finding opportunities for their personal faith expression. It is clear, based on walking into classrooms and seeing teachers’ deep hopes displayed and in talking with them, that teachers have a clear faith commitment. Numerous teachers noted that they were drawn to Sheboygan Christian due to its focus on faith and how it permeates everything.

- 5. Sheboygan Christian School prioritizes close community as it continues to expand and embraces opportunities to welcome new families. The Site Visit Team often heard the appreciation for the supportive environment and expressions of God’s love lived out daily.
- 6. Educators have a clear vision for academic excellence and seek ways to further this priority to continue to grow and improve. This is not merely an academic pursuit, but flows from the school’s God-given mission.

SCS received the following recommendations consistent with school improvement goals:

- 1. While there is clear evidence of a variety of modes of communication established between administration, staff, students, and parents, stakeholders interviewed spoke to a “historical knowledge” that’s sometimes difficult to access. The Site Visit Team recognizes that the staff and school have grown quickly and there are further plans to engage families and communicate. Parent data and teacher surveys, while positive, also recognize communication as an opportunity for the school. This opportunity may also be addressed by the new engagement team model to help facilitate new family onboarding and meaningful communication.
- 2. Sheboygan Christian School seeks to address the academic, behavioral, social, emotional, and spiritual needs of all students and plans to further identify interventions and supports to better meet those needs.
- 3. The school will address the use of data to communicate with stakeholders and inform instructional practices.
- 4. The Site Visit Team commends Sheboygan Christian School for its future School Improvement Plan goal of providing coaching and peer support and professional development.

Please continue to pray for SCS teachers and administration as they make plans for continual improvement in living out our school’s mission.



Geele Ave Campus Sign Gets Placed in Middle School Pod

Thanks to our thoughtful friends at A Million Dreamz Childcare (the business that bought our Geele campus), we were able to recover both of the exterior signs from our old school building. Recently, one of these signs was installed in the new Middle School student commons.

For decades, this sign watched over the parking lot playground at our beloved Geele Campus.

These aluminum letters saw thousands of children riding bikes to school, jumping rope, running, shooting baskets, building snow forts, and playing kickball. They even occasionally saw legendary middle school teacher Mr. Steve Van Drunen scale a ladder to fetch especially impressive kickball home runs that landed on the school roof.

Most importantly, this sign hung as a constant reminder to our school community and our neighborhood that we are a Christian school, and that Jesus Christ is preeminent in everything that we do—from our studies to our play.

In 2023, this sign was installed at our 929 Greenfield site in the student center of our new middle school as a reminder of God’s faithfulness to our school across locations and generations.

RECORD ENROLLMENT AND THE NICE PROBLEM OF RUNNING OUT OF CLASSROOMS

The Background

In 2016, this school community stepped out in faith to merge two schools into one. In the fall of 2021, we opened the doors of Sheboygan County’s first ever P-12 Christian School building. When we added two brand new elementary pods onto the former high school only campus, the Board of Trustees also approved the framing out of a middle school space in preparation for potential future growth.

The vision was for conservative school enrollment growth to fill that space in 7 years. We filled it in 7 months! This accelerated timeline had us complete a brand new middle school pod for the fall of 2022.

The Nice Problem

The new middle school space was originally designed with just four classrooms in place. When we filled those classrooms

more quickly than anticipated, the steering committee was able to produce a creative solution:

- Eliminate the proposed middle school locker rooms and custodians closet from this phase of the construction and produce a temporary 5th classroom in the middle school pod.
- Cap enrollment in the rising 6th grade class to keep it at only one track until that class graduates 8th grade.
- Plan for a 6+ classroom middle school pod for the fall of 2025 when the final one track class is promoted to high school.

This creative solution has bought us some time. But we’re on the clock again. By the fall of 2025, SCS will need additional middle school learning space.

The Ticking Enrollment Clock

In addition to the needed middle school growth, we are substantially growing in the high school as well. This chart details future enrollment projections.

By the fall of 2026, we anticipate being close to 200 high school students. For comparison, the high school enrollment was 87 students as recently as the 2019-2020 school year. The Board’s vision for high school enrollment is to limit growth to 60 students in each class for a maximum enrollment of 240 students.

Our current high school student population operates with 12 learning spaces: 9 general education classrooms and 3 specialty spaces (art studio, music room, shop). In order to keep the current ratio of students to classrooms, we will need an additional 10 learning spaces before we hit 240 students. The steering committee is currently reviewing options to phase in high school facility growth in order to prepare for the future.
