Reflections From An Outgoing Board President

This year, we celebrated 125 years of God’s faithfulness towards Sheboygan Christian School. As I reflect on that, I am amazed at God’s faithfulness to Sheboygan Christian School.

125 years ago, a group of immigrants from the Netherlands established Sheboygan Christian School. I decided to do a little research into my family history. Both of my great grandparents, (names), were born in the late 1890’s in Sheboygan. They were part of that group that started our school. This inspired me to think more about SCS’s history, how God has remained faithful to the school, and where we are today.

Over the past six years, I have had the privilege of serving on the Board of Trustees. I can tell you these years were not all easy. We worked through COVID-19, building projects, and many other stressors, but these have been some of the most rewarding years of my life.

Our school theme this year is “Faithful, He has done it.” It is based on Hebrews 10:23:

“Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful.”

What does it mean to hold unswervingly to the hope we profess? It is to cling firmly, stand resolutely, and remain steadfast in the face of adversity.

Since my children started at Sheboygan Christian School back in

2002, our school has faced quite a bit of adversity. We had an elementary school that was facing declining enrollment, and we had a high school that had acquired substantial operating debt. But, through all of this, God remained faithful. He gave the Boards of two different schools the vision to join together to become one. And He gave this new Board the vision to hire a new administrator (Ann Steenwyk) who would help us focus on our mission.

As I reflect on my past six years on the Board of Trustees, I can surely see that God is at work at Sheboygan Christian School. We are faced with new opportunities and challenges of growing enrollment and not enough space. Six years ago, I never would have believed these would be our challenges.

God is enough for Sheboygan Christian School. He always will be as long as we put Him at the center of who we are and as long as we submit to His leading. It is humbling and exciting to imagine what God has in store for us for the next 125 years. Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, not wavering in our faith, but standing firm on the solid foundation of God’s Word. Let us anchor our hearts in the assurance that God is faithful, and His promises are trustworthy.

As our school theme says, “Faithful, He has done it.”

Mr. Elgersma’s job has significantly changed over the years. As recently as 5 years ago, Mr. Elgersma was a custodian over 48,000 square feet with 87 high school students and a handful of faculty members. In his last year of service, our school had grown to 88,000 square feet, over 550 students and 60 faculty and staff members. That’s many more floors, windows, desks and chairs to clean, garbage and recycling to empty, and maintenance requests to fulfil! With this massively increased workload and a maintenance team to work with, Mr. Elgersma faithfully and selflessly did his job.

Building Loan Debt Reduction

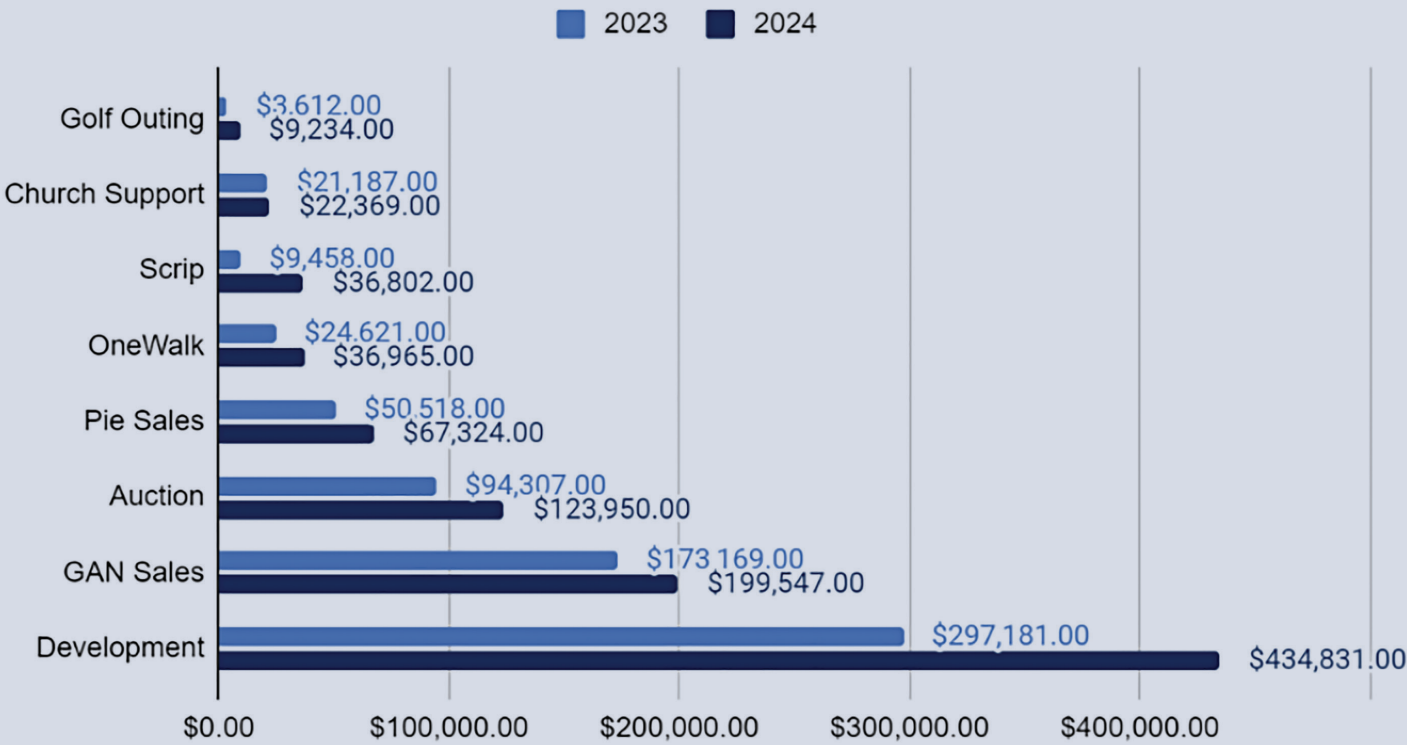

Enrollment Breakdown: 565 students total

- Elementary School: 241 students
- Middle School: 104 students
- High School: 169 students

Key Financial Changes:

- Average tuition increases of 4%
- 3% salary increase for all employees
- 20% rise in health benefits costs due to additional families and higher premiums

The projected net revenue for the 2023-2024 fiscal year has been adjusted to account for the remainder of the year, including a loan reduction payment of \$550,000 applied to liabilities and additional internal expenses. The anticipated shortfall will be offset by future donations; however, for the purposes of fiscal year-end projections, the deficit will be included in our financial statements. Additionally, if funds are drawn from our unrestricted foundation account, accounting will reflect this as a loss.

As we look to the future, we remain steadfast in our commitment to excellence and innovation in education. With the continued support of our community, we are poised to build upon the successes of the past year and embark on new initiatives that will enhance the educational experience for our students and strengthen the fabric of our community.

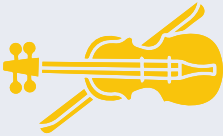

Enrollment Update

NOW WE'RE REALLY
RUNNING OUT OF SPACE

Sheboygan Christian School continues to grow! The
spring 2023 Flyer announced "Record Enrollment and
the Nice Problem of Running out of Classrooms."

Over a year ago, we projected that High School
Enrollment in the fall of 2024 would be 167 students. We
are currently projecting 172 high school students for the
2024-2025 school year.

As a result of this growth, things will be tight next fall. We
have executed the following plans to accommodate for
growing enrollment:

- No "Stand alone" shop classroom. We will now be
running our middle school STEM and high school
computer science classes in this shop-adjacent
classroom. Due to increased programming needs
in both STEM and shop, we will need to have
students in both the classroom space and shop
simultaneously.
- Some study halls
will now be in the
cafeteria due to
all HS classrooms
being in session
during these periods
of the day.
- Most high school
teachers have
no "home room"
prep. There will
be virtually no
open high school
classrooms without
students over the
course of the day.

While none of these
temporary administrative
solutions is ideal, we
are maximizing the
resources available to
ensure an excellent
Christian education
for all of our students.
Our Association has

approved a building plan that we will enact as soon as we
have the funding to do so.

Without building, we will run out of space in the fall of 2025.
We anticipate 172 high school students in the coming year.
We will graduate out 27 seniors and take in another freshmen
class of over 40 students. We anticipate 185 high school
students for the 2025-2026 school year. This greatly exceeds
our earlier projections.

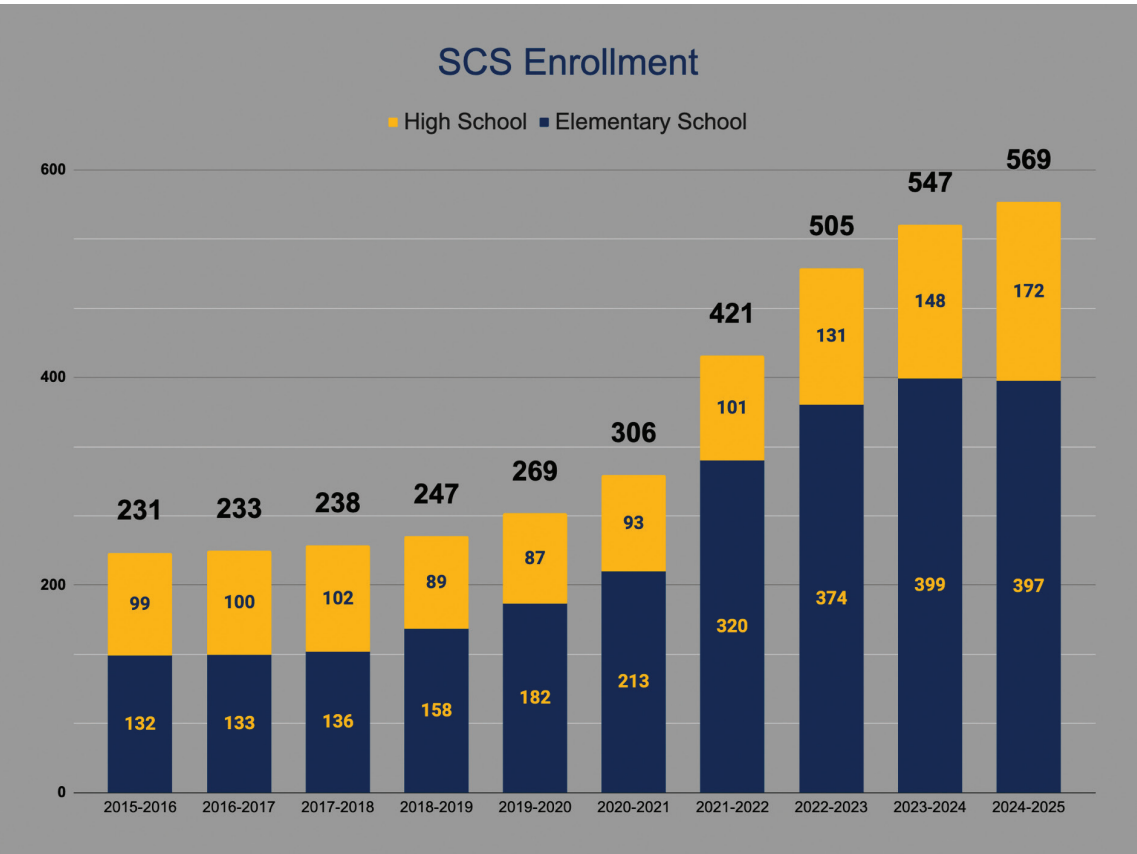
The same is true for our middle school. The last (artificially
capped) "one section" grade level is being promoted out of
8th grade in the spring of 2025. This means that our five
classroom middle school will run out of space for the needed
six classrooms.

Without building, we will be looking at the addition of portable
classrooms, which come with their own sets of "pros and cons."

So, what's the plan?

To build! Please prayerfully consider financially contributing to
the facility planning team's vision for the future of our campus
in Phase Three of our master plan. We will build at the rate

Building Hearts *and* Minds

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Where have we been? Where are we going?

SCS is on the precipice of a third building project in five years. This unprecedented series of building expansions comes on the heels of the largest enrollment in the 125 year history of our school. We are humbled by God’s provision to our school community, and excited to see the plans that he has in store for us in the years to come.

In order to understand the context of our building projects, we thought it would be helpful to take a little stroll down the building memory lane. Here are the highlights of each of the building phases:

PHASE 1: COMPLETED
SUMMER, 2021

- P-12 Enrollment at the time of completion: 306
- Added 40,000 square feet
- Brought the Elementary School from Geele to Greenfield
- Cost: \$8,500,000
- Remaining financing on this project at the end of the 24/25 fiscal year: \$3,200,000.



PHASE 2: COMPLETED
SUMMER, 2022

- P-12 Enrollment at the time of completion: 421
- Added 7,600 square feet
- Allowed Middle School to vacate former High School space, returning 4 classrooms to the High School.
- Two classrooms per grade level necessitates new building project by fall, 2025
- Cost: \$1,150,000
- No debt associated with this project



PHASE 3: PROJECTED
COMPLETION
SUMMER, 2025

- Projected P-12 Enrollment at the time of completion: 569
- Projected to add 35,000 square feet to the facility and remodel another 7,800 square feet.

- Increased space for middle and high school
- Increased programming for middle and high school
- Master-planned site work that allows for smoother future work and no lost costs on future phases
- Projected cost: \$10,000,000 (Association meeting approved new debt ceiling of \$8.5 million)
- Current funds raised: \$1,100,000
- Funds still needed to reach our milestone: \$1,400,000

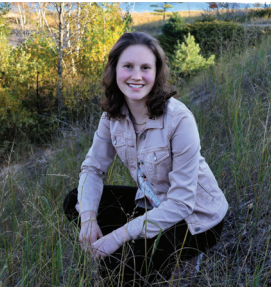
